Message from our President

The Batavia Mothers' Club Foundation has completed its 84th year as a philanthropic organization at the heart of the community. Thanks to the generosity of our sponsors and the tireless efforts of our dedicated members, we were able to fulfill our mission and disburse \$23,893 to local schools and organizations at our spring disbursement reception. A total of 11 schools, including 3 preschools, and 36 community organizations were awarded disbursements to help fund programs that improve the quality of life for children and families in our community. This brought our final full-year donations over \$27,600.

Our members gave freely of their time in order to plan and carry out three successful fundraisers over the past year. The Fall Craft and Vendor show, held in October, brought approximately 900 people to Batavia High School to visit over 100 artisan and vendor booths. In February, everyone had a blast at Totally Rad 80s Bunco. The event was our most successful Bunco event to date. It was followed by an equally successful Fox Trot 5K/10K run. Over 350 runners, ranging in age from 3 – 92, took to the Fox River Trail on a crisp morning in April. We truly enjoyed seeing all the smiles as good was done, fun was had, and memories were made at each of these events.

Although much of our time was spent preparing for our three major fundraisers, we also participated in several community events and community improvement projects. Our members organized and ran the Diaper Derby at the Windmill Festival. We welcomed novice teachers in BPS 101 with Target gift cards and collected winter coats for the Clothes Closet through our annual coat drive. We collected hams for families in need at Thanksgiving and provided Christmas gifts for 30 children through the United Way Adopt a Family program. Our members also volunteered their time to help with the ACCESS toy drive and Library summer reading kickoff. Our monthly Share and Care collections allowed members to donate goods to support local charities.

It has been my honor and privilege to serve as the president of this wonderful organization. The women whom I've had the pleasure of leading and serving alongside are so much more than just moms, as are all mothers everywhere. We all wear many hats, but the women in this organization are some of the kindest, smartest, funniest, hardest working, and most innovative people I've ever known. I am blessed to call them friends, and I am so proud of all we have accomplished over the past year. I know we will continue to do great things for our community. I want to express my sincere gratitude to all of our hard-working members, our incredible sponsors, our loyal community, our understanding families, and the many organizations that work relentlessly to fulfill the needs in our community.
